Trash pickup is every Tuesday by Republic. We advise to have cans on curb by 6 am for pickup. Green waste (ONLY yard trimmings) pickup is every 3rd Wednesday of each month. Please DO NOT place by curb earlier than the weekend prior to the Wednesday pickup. If green waste is placed by the curb earlier than the weekend prior to the 3rd Wednesday, resident will be responsible for removing it.

We will be having a roll-off dumpster coming in after the New Year starts to allow for big and bulky items and to help residents keep their homes and yards free of unwanted/needed items that are NOT normally picked up by our maintenance team on their Wednesday pickup.

Management is currently working with the City of Tucson Waste Management in flushing the sewer lines within the park.

REGARDING WATER LEAK ISSUES

Park maintenance is responsible for water leaks from BELOW the water meter and going to the mainline. Residents are responsible for any water issues ABOVE the water meter and going into the homes.

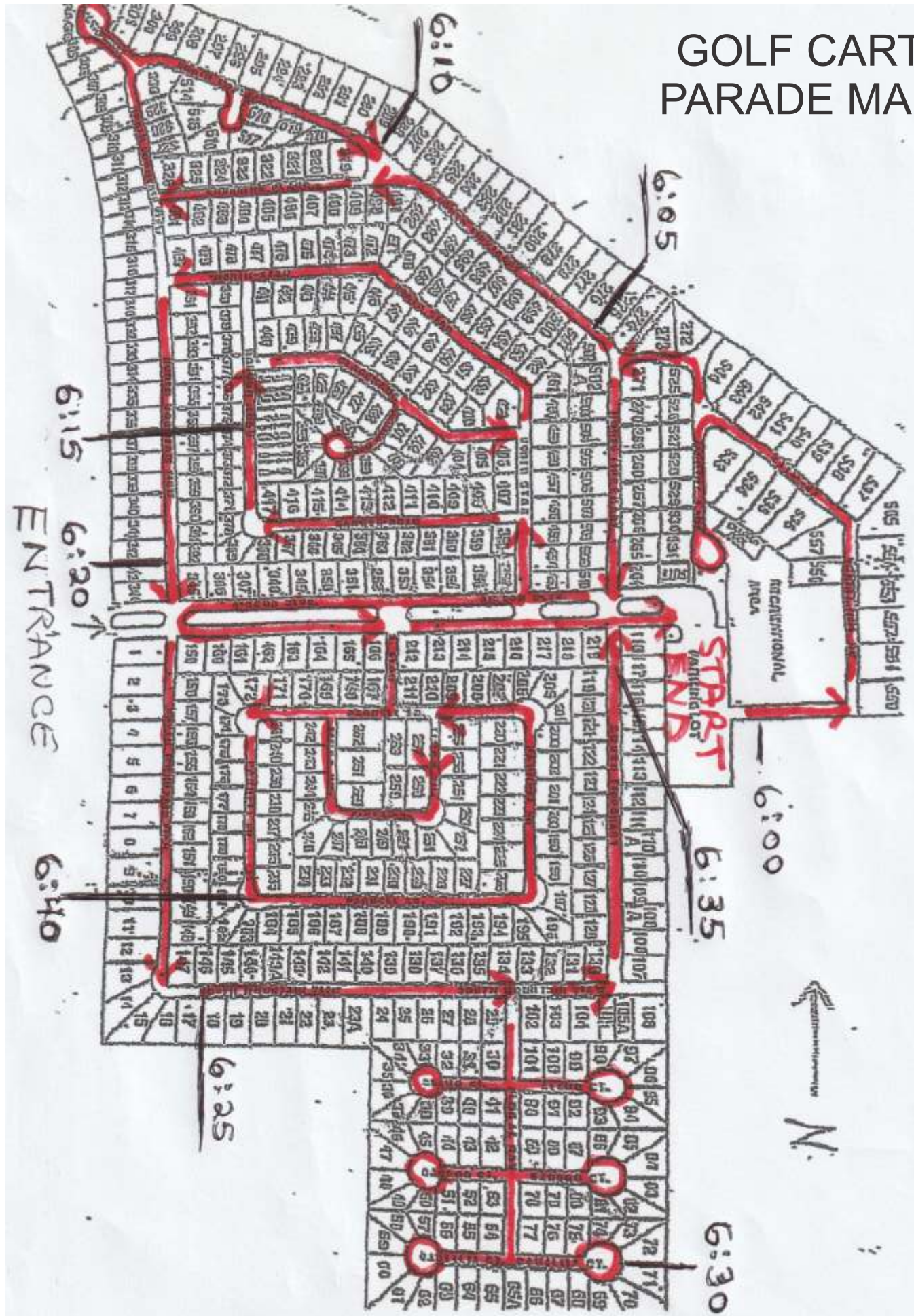

Happy to be back in Tucson, we thought life was going to settle down, but as we know, life happens.

Tracers Ltd., blossomed into something I had never imagined. I traveled, spoke at conventions and in my own small way I achieved some sort of stardom. When I traveled, my friends would ask if George was babysitting the kids. I said, "No, he is parenting them!" People often have the misconception that fathers only babysit their children because the real job falls on mom. However, this was not the case in our household.

I had achieved another real purpose in my life. I became more than just a wife, mom, teacher; I had become an independent woman, able to think my own thoughts and travel my own path. It was wonderful.

During the next years, Tracers Ltd grew almost faster than I thought possible. I became extremely organized and I could research with the best of them. Enter another thought. As adoption laws slowly moved forward, so did I. I realized that I wanted more time at home with George and the kids. I sold my business to a private eye in Chicago and created Management Extraordinaire.

Enter the world of big business, teaching and hoarders. I became a professional organizer. I went into business offices creating working systems, time-saving ways to do easy and difficult tasks. I went into homes where I was walking through narrow paths of books, papers and crap.

I also finally realized I could use my humor to help clients deal with the mess. I was contacted by Pima Community College asking me to teach a workshop about humor in the classroom. I expanded it to workshops for a wonderful group in Tucson, Resources for Women. I became involved in ASTD, American Society for Training and Development. I loved it. I had found another venue I could easily fill.

My children grew, George and I grew closer and closer. What a man! The man who would let me be me. And then the phone call came.

George called me from St. Joseph's hospital saying he thought he was having a heart attack and if it was anything serious, he would call me back. I thought he was nuts and said, "if you die, who is going to call me?" I jumped into the car and got there as quickly as I could. Thank God, it was not a heart attack, but high blood pressure, very high. He told me if he had to teach another day, he would kill himself. George was a Special Education teacher at Santa Rita High School, just a few miles

from where we lived. He loved teaching he just couldn't handle issues with the politics. I told him to quit.

We talked about what he would do. Quitting teaching meant I wouldn't have health insurance and he was ready to retire. I told him to quit, that I would rather have no insurance than a dead husband. He retired and I tried staying healthy.

In 2010 I had Medicare. Lucky for us we were covered because we both came down with Cancer. He had surgery and I barely made it through with radiation and chemo. Once the word CANCER is in your life, the world changes, like walking into a brick wall. He took care of me, a job worthy of an Oscar. He helped me live.

George decided to become a travel agent. He found a school in Tucson for the meager sum of Five thousand dollars. There was an added benefit, your spouse could attend classes. After the 3rd class, George quit. Not me. I took the class, graduated and opened "All You Do is Pack."

That's all you did. I arranged everything. I built a great clientele, and a Big benefit, we got to travel. Best trip yet was to Fiji. I could write reams on Fiji but it was so wonderful that George kiddingly said he would ask for political asylum. He loved it that much.

So, you see that my life has been full of wonderment, creativity, and the best part, a man who loves me for who I am and let me be the woman I was meant to be without being threatened. I have two children, grandchildren and a new life. Two years ago this month we bought our home in Rincon Country Mobile Home Park.

I love this park and the people in it. I'm healthy enough to participate in helping make it a wonderful place to live. Covid-19 came along and stripped the park of so many things. Still and all, we are able to walk with others, wave at those sitting on their porches or riding their bikes.

I have no idea what the future holds. I just know I want to be part of it and as long as I have my health, I look forward to helping out. We need more people to volunteer.
