LOTS

This is an ongoing issue...please keep your lots free of clutter, debris and trash. This is a 55 and older community and it needs to represent such. Per your Rules and Regulations, II. Lot and Home Control, 14, “Standard lawn furniture, bicycles, barbeques, trash can and storage shed(s) are the only items permitted to be stored outside of the mobile home. Residents shall maintain their space in a clean and orderly fashion, caring for all plantings, trees and shrubs, including keeping their lot free of weeds. Plantings or trees may not be removed without management's approval. Additional planting must be approved in advance to prevent disturbing underground utility lines.

REGARDING WATER LEAKS

Park maintenance is responsible for water leaks **BELOW** the meter and going to the mainline. Residents are responsible for any water issues **ABOVE** the water meter and going into the home.

SALE OF HOMES

As per your Rules and Regulations paragraph 16 section A:

Anyone planning to sell their home in the Park needs to be sure that management has inspected the home for Park approval to sell. ****This responsibility should NOT fall upon a new homeowner****

A Family Tale

Sometimes I wish I was a Native American, sitting inside a giant teepee, a blazing fire in the middle and all my family and friends sitting quietly next to each other, almost touching but not, and listening to some elder telling the story of our ancestors. With that thought in mind I have children and grandchildren who only know a small sampling of where they came from and the stories that will probably die when I do. Maybe this will change something.

I am of Polish and Lithuanian decent. All of my grandparents came over to the United States in steerage, under horrible sanitary conditions, lack of food, privacy, disease and death. (I think of these horrible conditions and complain when my plane is delayed and I have hours to spend in a climate controlled airport, where there is every type of food, clothing, bookstores, medical attention and bathrooms every 50 feet.)

My grandparents had a dream of coming to America where the streets were paved with gold. Little did they know. They came over not knowing any English and being sponsored by a family member. They landed, exhausted and sick, at Ellis Island. They were dressed shabbily, had almost no money and stood in endless lines being examined. They had the clothes on their back and a suitcase which held their meager possessions. Everything they had, they left behind with the dream that life here would be better. They came to make a new life.

(You should know that the first time I visited Ellis Island, I went through all the rooms where all the photographs are displayed. Lo and behold if I didn't find a picture of my grandfather. I found a guide and asked to speak to an archivist. I told her the story of my grandfather and took a picture of the picture that was hanging on the wall. There

are thousands of these photos displayed and most are without any explanation.)

When they were restoring Ellis Island, I wrote to every family member on both sides of my family asking them to contribute a small amount so that I could have my grandparent's names on the memorial wall. I needed to raise \$400 so that both sets of my grandparent's names would be on it. Everyone contributed and when I visited Ellis Island, their names were there. I did rubbings of their names.

My paternal grandpa Louie was a successful merchant in Lithuania. He had his own store (the family lived above the store) sold dry goods and provided for Sarah and their one daughter Bailey. They escaped Jewish persecution and death.

After their 6-week stay at Ellis Island, they lived with my grandpa's cousin. Grandpa Louie bought a horse and wagon and began collecting things, which he sold second hand. He might have been the first mobile thrift store. He and Grandma Sarah went to school with my Aunt Bailey to learn English. They were eager to become good American citizens and eventually naturalized almost 10 years after arriving in Chicago. In the meantime they had 3 more children, Bernard, Harry (my father), and Irving.

My grandpa scrimped and saved so that his children could go to school. Bernard became a famous psychiatrist, Bailey was the only white teacher in an all-black school and became a wonderful artist and sculptress. Harry became a dentist and an inventor. He invented the first gadget that held the x-ray film called the Snap-A-Ray. Irving worked for a specialized food market. All went on to marry and have families. All the cousins were close and spent wonderful holidays together.

My grandma Sarah was a real peach. *(To be continued...)*
