
















Porch Concerts at the Gaslight Theater

The team has worked very hard to keep the feral cat population under control. We have had a lot of people moving and some are leaving their pets behind. Some of these animals are not spayed or neutered causing more kittens and more feral cats.

Benefits of Getting a COVID-19 Vaccine

We understand that some people may be concerned about getting vaccinated now that COVID-19 vaccines are available in the United States. While more COVID-19 vaccines are being developed as quickly as possible, routine processes and procedures remain in place to ensure the safety of any vaccine that is authorized or approved for use. Safety is a top priority, and there are many reasons to get vaccinated.

Can a COVID-19 vaccine make me sick with COVID-19?

No. None of the COVID-19 vaccines contain the live virus that causes COVID-19 so a COVID-19 vaccine cannot make you sick with COVID-19.

COVID-19 vaccination will help keep you from getting COVID-19

- All COVID-19 vaccines currently available in the United States have been shown to be highly effective at preventing COVID-19.
- All COVID-19 vaccines that are in development are being carefully evaluated in clinical trials and will be authorized or approved only if they make it substantially less likely you'll get COVID-19.
- Based on what we know about vaccines for other diseases and early data from clinical trials, experts believe that getting a COVID-19 vaccine may also help keep you from getting seriously ill even if you do get COVID-19.
- Getting vaccinated yourself may also protect people around you, particularly people at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19.
- Experts continue to conduct more studies about the effect of COVID-19 vaccination on severity of illness from COVID-19, as well as its ability to keep people from spreading the virus that causes COVID-19.

COVID-19 vaccination is a safer way to help build protection

- COVID-19 can have serious, life-threatening complications, and there is no way to know how COVID-19 will affect you. And if you get sick, you could spread the disease to friends, family, and others around you.
- Clinical trials of all vaccines must first show they are safe and effective before any vaccine can be authorized or approved for use, including COVID-19 vaccines. The known and potential benefits of a COVID-19 vaccine must outweigh the known and potential risks of the vaccine for use under what is known as an Emergency Use Authorization (EUA).
- Getting COVID-19 may offer some natural protection, known as immunity. Current evidence suggests that reinfection with the virus that causes COVID-19 is uncommon in the 90 days after initial infection. However, experts don't know for sure how long this protection lasts, and the risk of severe illness and death from COVID-19 far outweighs any benefits of natural immunity. COVID-19 vaccination will help protect you by creating an antibody (immune system) response without having to experience sickness.
- Both natural immunity and immunity produced by a vaccine are important parts of COVID-19 disease that experts are trying to learn more about, and CDC will keep the public informed as new evidence becomes available.

COVID-19 vaccination will be an important tool to help stop the pandemic

- Wearing masks and social distancing help reduce your chance of being exposed to the virus or spreading it to others, but these measures are not enough. Vaccines will work with your immune system so it will be ready to fight the virus if you are exposed.
- The combination of getting vaccinated and following CDC's recommendations to protect yourself and others will offer the best protection from COVID-19.
- Stopping a pandemic requires using all the tools we have available. As experts learn more about how COVID-19 vaccination may help reduce spread of the disease in communities, CDC will continue to update the recommendations to protect communities using the latest science.

A Family Tale - Part 3

Abraham Lurie was a wheeler dealer and a millionaire.

You might ask, where did the money go...

Your great-grandfather Abraham, his wife Esther and 2 children came from Poland to escape the Russians. They came over in steerage and they, like your paternal great-grandparents, suffered the hardships just to come to America. My grandmother Esther told me they threw the bodies of the passengers who died over the side of the ship, no funeral, no service, just rolled up in a blanket to be devoured by the sea.

They also arrived through Ellis Island. Children, you really need to read up on the conditions at Ellis Island. I have been many times and each time while on the Ferry, I start to cry. I absolutely cannot even begin to imagine what their reactions were when they realized they had landed in New York City and saw the Statue of Liberty.

Grandpa Abe was in real estate, bought and sold many properties in Chicago and made himself a small fortune. In the meantime, he and Esther had a total of 11 children, my mother, your Grandmother Bell, was the youngest. She had 5 brothers and 5 sisters. All of them were successful. Two of the sisters, Dorothy and Jean owned a dress shop on Rush Street in Chicago. All high-end fashion and they did very well. Sam Lurie was an attorney who bought and sold property. He bought a

piece of property and oil was discovered on it. He went to court for years until he finally got the oil rights. The case went all the way to the Supreme Court and the case study and proceedings are here in Tucson, at the Law Library of the University of Arizona.

It was a colorful and adventurous family. Esther had 2 brothers, Joe Carasic and Nathan Carasic. Joe was known as 'Machine Gun Joe,' not because he was a gunslinger for the Chicago Mob but because he was a dealer in a Speakeasy and dealt the cards so quickly he was nicknamed Machine Gun Joe. Nathan on the other hand was quite the ladies-man. His love of women caused his death. One night he was at a Speakeasy when the cops came and raided to joint. To escape, he climbed the stairs to the roof where he thought he could hide out. It was a cold winter night and ice had formed on the roof tiles. He slipped, fell off the roof and broke his neck and died at the scene.

Great-grandpa Abe died on the train coming from California. He died of a heart attack. Oh the millions I told you about, he lost everything but one apartment building during the Crash of 1929. I was told that Esther always had a large pot of soup on the table and anyone who came to her door was given a bowl of soup. Many people killed themselves after the crash but the Lurie family survived and things eventually got better.
